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Abstract: The COVID-19 pandemic has enormously affected everyday life in its social, cultural, economic and political dimensions. After about a year of living with this pandemic, the emergence of vaccines is hope in the sense that thecontrol of the pandemic will finally be achieved and, consequently, there will be a return to certain normality in terms of interaction, which will not be the same as in the past, in our opinion. This presentation analyses the impacts that COVID-19 may have in the future, focusing, in particular, in the centrality ofdigital sustainability on ultra-peripheral communities, which are geographically distant from the centres of political and economic decision-making.

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Resistance strategies of Aymara communities in the Peruvian highlands in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic crisis

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Abstract— The objective is to describe, interpret and analyze the different strategies that the Aymara communities have undertaken in the context of the Peruvian highlands in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic crisis. The methodology used is qualitative, it focuses on ethnography, such as the interpretation of the data. The results show, firstly, the current collective concept of the pandemic and its possible consequences; secondly, the actions that have been recreated from daily life to face and face the health crisis; and thirdly, the perceptions and challenges that they see from their own experiences.
